The other night I caught a part of the Piers Morgan interview show and watched while a gun advocate attacked his position with wild accusations and hostile language. Morgan favors gun control and is English.

- *We have become a nation of people who look outside of ourselves to end the cause of our inner pain and we have become a nation of people who approve doing that. The words of compromise and collaboration have been drowned out by accusations and intractable opinion.*

- *We seem to forget that our children are listening, our mentally ill are listening, other countries are listening.*

If this is to become a new age as the Mayans have predicted then our Words must change and we must lay claim to our pain and care for the pain of others.

Calling All Professional Spiritual Caregivers and Educators! (Part Two)

Outcomes research conducted in the US has not yet yielded well-established findings. However, a spiritual care effectiveness survey was commissioned by UK National Health Service Education for Scotland and developed by Mowat Research. The twelve themes derived from the Scots' thorough analysis of the literature and other sources have been incorporated in a US version. A simple twelve statement survey is given to patients/clients for completion shortly after a typical PSC visit. Even better: partner with a trusted peer regularly to share mutual insights from these summaries.

Spiritual Care Situation Summary

(Save this form as a Word document for multiple uses before entering a specific situation.)

- 1. The Spiritual Care Situation's Central Issue** (Be concise. Examples are *feeling lonely*, *facing terminal illness*, and *loss of faith*.)

- 2. Narrative Summary of the Situation and Spiritual Care Provided** (Enter here a few descriptive paragraphs about the situation, your effort, and the response to that effort. Take confidentiality precautions.)

- 3. Narrative Summary of What Would Be the Most Effective Spiritual Care** (Enter a few descriptive paragraphs about how you would or would not do it differently if given another opportunity in this situation. Write so that another practitioner with a similar situation could benefit from your insights.)

- 4. Resources that you would recommend to other spiritual care givers regarding this situation** (Books, journal articles, pamphlets, etc. Be as specific as possible so that others can find them.)

The process of becoming an ACPE Supervisor is long and difficult, but a survey in 2010 of all active and retired supervisors (who use email) yielded a wealth of information about many facets of training. Some of the findings involved the “most important elements” of the process, as well as trends in demographics. The workshop will also explore issues such as “What are the characteristics of a good potential supervisory student?” and “What are the pros and cons of recruiting new trainees?” Please come and share your experiences and opinions.

The Rev. Dr. Amy Greene has been Director of Clinical Pastoral Education at the Cleveland Clinic since 2007. Before that she directed one the largest CPE programs in the country in her hometown of Atlanta. She is endorsed by the Alliance of Baptists and is a graduate of Union Theological Seminary in New York (M.Div. 1986) and Ecumenical Theological Seminary of Detroit (D.Min. 2012). Her theory papers, passed in 2000, were published in the 2003 Journal of Supervision and Training in Ministry (now Reflective Practice). For seven years she has served as one of the readers for Theory Papers of the Year. She is married to Thomas Reuter and they are the obnoxiously proud parents of two grown sons, who live on the East and West coasts respectively.

- **Workshop B: “Assessing Student Learning in CPE” - Wayne McKenney**
Would you like to help your Level I students recognize their strengths and weaknesses, assess their pastoral skills, learn Level I outcomes, and assess their pastoral formation? Would you like to help students develop learning goals and write better final evaluations? Would you like help in evaluating student work and preparing better supervisory evaluations? This workshop will present a Rating Guide, validated by research with students and supervisors in the ECR that will help you accomplish these outcomes [and more] in your supervisory practice!

The Rev. Dr. Wayne McKenney serves as a contract supervisor at the Detroit Medical Center Vanguard CPE Center, located at Sinai Grace Hospital in northwest Detroit. He and his wife Susan married in 1973, live in Wyandotte, MI where she teaches first grade students in one of the public schools. Wayne graduated from MSU with a BA in Human Communications, a Master of Divinity, from United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities, New Brighton, MN and a Doctor of Ministry from Ecumenical Theological Seminary in Detroit, MI. Wayne is an ordained pastor within the United Church of Christ, who served more than 30 years as a local church pastor, 19 years as a volunteer police chaplain for the Wyandotte Police Department, and as a Wyandotte School Board member and President. He currently serves on the ECR Accreditation Committee.

Board Meeting Summary

November 15-17, 2012

I. Jewish Supervisors Network

- Representatives of the JSN met with the Board to continue the discussion begun in August regarding the scheduling of the 2013 Annual Conference during the Holy Days of Shavuot. A document stating the concerns of the JSN was distributed to the Board. To briefly summarize, the statement requested ACPE to post on its website a multi-faith calendar to be used as a resource in the planning of regional and national events, and in the planning of educational calendars for interfaith CPE groups. The Board approved the creation of this calendar to be posted on the website by the end of 2012.

II. Finance Report

- The finances of ACPE continue to be solid. A surplus is anticipated again this year (amount projected to be in the same range as 2011). Surplus is due to several factors: increase in center fees, increase in dues for supervisors and candidates, and staff expenses below projections due to Associate Director serving in IED position.

III. Personnel

- Personnel committee is currently working on job descriptions for the ED and CFO.
- Board authorized the President to appoint a committee (with diverse membership) to conduct a search process for a CEO/ED of ACPE.
- The Board approved second terms for Ted Trout-Landen (Chair), Jo Clare Wilson and Doug Watson.

IV. Strategic Planning Process

- Strategic Initiative work groups have been assigned and tasked to create action plans for each of the six strategic initiatives in the Strategic Planning Process. The Strategic Plan is posted on the website. Please contact the chairs of each work group with your thoughts, feedback, etc.

V. APC/ACPE Collaboration

- The APC/ACPE Collaboration Team presented five recommendations to the Board for consideration. Those recommendations have been referred to the appropriate commissions/committees and strategic planning work groups for further conversation and consideration.
- The ACPE leadership will also reach out to the leadership of NACC and NAJC to invite them into the conversation.

VI. CPSP

- The Board voted not to re-engage in dialogue with CPSP. Deryck and Robin will draft a letter to be sent to Ray Lawrence, General Secretary of CPSP. ACPE's decision does not in any way give license to our membership to make disparaging comments about CPSP. We will treat each other with respect and honor each other's CPE programs and processes. ACPE centers will be invited to receive **ALL** CPE applications and process those applications based on the center's admissions criteria.

VII. REM/ACPE Dialogue

- The REM/ACPE dialogue team met on Wednesday, November 14 to continue the dialogue regarding the future relationship between REM and ACPE. The Board approved a motion to create a demographic database for ACPE – this will be referred to the Technology Strategic Initiative Work Group. A demographic database will help us to have a greater understanding of the diversity within our Association and therefore help us to plan better to meet the needs of our constituents. The board also approved a motion to refer to the Certification Strategic Initiative Work group the following items from the ACPE/REM report: the development of an intentional recruitment/retention process for persons of color in ACPE supervision, and a redesigning of the certification process that is more hospitable to all SES.
- REM will also in its meeting in February 2013, revisit its mission and vision and explore the nomenclature for the REM Network.

VIII. Clinical Members

- The Board approved funding from the 2012 surplus for a meeting in Indianapolis of the Clinical Member Advisory Council. This group last met in 2008 at the annual meeting in Richmond, VA. Our clinical members play an important role within the association, and ACPE has a strong commitment to continue to grow our clinical members and more fully utilize their expertise on diverse levels within the association which aligns with our Collaborative Relationships Strategic Plan and vision.

IX. Governance

- The Board approved replacing the Board Competencies and Job Description previously presented to the regions with the following: *Board Member Qualifications and Board Job Description and Expectations*. The membership will vote on governance bylaws changes in Indianapolis. Bylaws changes will be posted on the website 60 days prior to the annual meeting.

X. Program Grants

- ACPE's foundation raised \$16,000 for program grants in conjunction with its annual campaign. The association received twelve requests totaling about \$98,000. The Selection Committee selected four proposals. No recipient received the entire amount they requested. The recommended nominees all indicated partial funding would still be beneficial.
